Getting into the Hospitality Industry: Required permits and where to get them?

Use our checklist to get ready for your hospitality project in Brussels!





Your checklist:

Planning permi

For what reason?

- Structural modification (Load-bearing wall, floor and ceiling, staircase, etc.)
- Architectural modifications
 - front facade (change colour, install bay window, frame, door, awning, sign, terrace, rotisserie, etc.)
 - rear facade (air-con/cold room condensing unit, chimney flue, etc.)
- Changes of purpose (function: retail, office, housing, etc.) and/or use (specific activity: launderette, trade in goods, etc.)
- Other actions and works are also subject to planning permit

Who should you contact?

- Municipality: Town Planning Department
- Region: urban.brussels (e.g. for a heritage-protected property)

Please note:

- In principle, permission must be obtained before the actions or works are carried out!
- There is a risk your application will be refused
- It often takes six months (or longer) to obtain planning permit
- Some municipalities have defined zones where it may be (very) difficult to create a new hospitality business (City of Brussels, Schaerbeek, etc.).

Environmental permits

For what reason?

- Certain businesses (bakery, butcher's, caterer, fishmonger, function room, etc.)
- Certain depots depending on the products and the size of the depot (waste, alcohol, flour, etc.)
- Certain machines (cold room, fridge, boiler, etc.)
- But also for other reasons, especially the broadcasting of amplified sound between midnight and 7 am

Who should you contact?

- Municipality: Environmental Permits Department
- Region: Brussels Environment (e.g. for a heritage-protected property)

Please note:

- In principle, a licence must be obtained before the classified facilities can be used!
- There are different classes of permits.
 There is a risk of refusal depending on the class, and the procedure takes between one and three months for the most common cases.

Hospitality operating licence

For what reason?

The operating licence is often conditional upon obtaining the SIAMU (emergency services) report, planning permit and/or an environmental permit (or just the complete file and various other elements, depending on the municipality)

Who should you contact?
